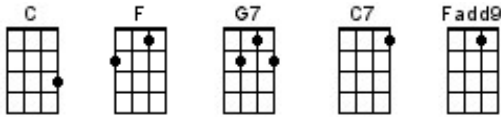


SINGING THE BLUES [D]

INTRO: D///, D///, {whistle} D///, G///, D///, G/ - A7/ - G///, A7///, D/ - G/ - D/ - A7

V1. Well, I (D) never felt more like (G) singing the blues

'Cause (D) I never thought that (G) I'd ever (A7) lose your (G) love dear,
(A7) Why'd you do me this (D/) way? (G/ - D/ - A7---)

V2. Well, I (D) never felt more like (G) cryin' all night

'Cause (D) everything's wrong, and (G) nothin' ain't (A7) right with-(G) out you
(A7) You got me singin' the (D/) blues. (G/ - D/ - D7---)

BRIDGE: The (G) moon and stars no (D) longer shine

The (G) dream is gone I (D) thought was mine

There's (G) nothin' left for (D) me to do

But (D↓) cry-y-y-y over (A) you (A7)
